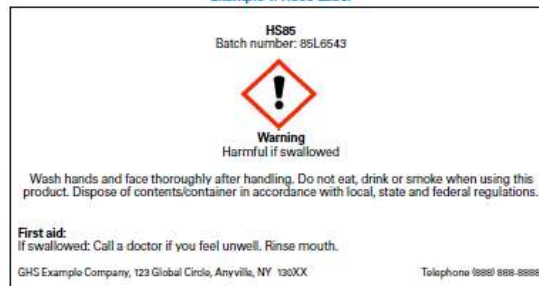

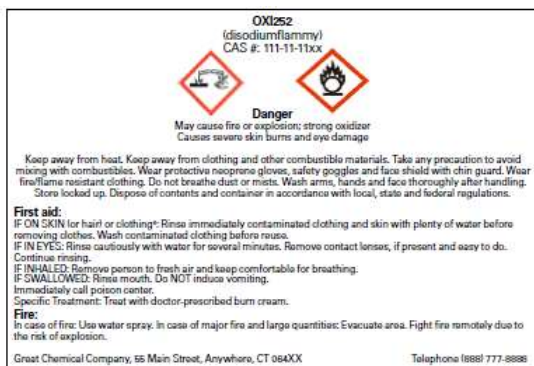

Q1: What is the deadline for converting labels to the new GHS pictogram labels?

A1: June 1, 2015- All manufacturers, importers and employers must comply with HAZCOM 2012 standards. New chemicals will not be produced or transported without SDS and label compliance.

Q2: What about the extended deadline of December 1, 2015?

A2: That deadline is for switching over existing inventories of materials that were labeled under the old standard. This deadline ends the transition period.

Q3: Are there any exceptions from labeling?

A3: Yes! There are still many labeling exceptions under the OSHA HAZCOM standard (29CFR 1910.1200(a)(5), including but not limited to:

- Pesticides and TSCA substances regulated by the EPA
- Food, additives, drugs, cosmetic, medical, etc., covered by FDCA
- Distilled spirits
- Consumer products, Tobacco products, wood products, articles
- Agricultural or vegetable seed covered by the Dept of Ag
- Hazardous waste (EPA - RCRA)
